




## to Accompany the Successful Sight Reading Program - Part One

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## Suggestions for use of the sentence strips:

Reading these sentence strips is a good way of practicing and reinforcing the new vocabulary. Encourage your students to read words in phrases, with the eye going ahead as the words are said aloud. In the beginning your students will read word-by-word, but practicing the sentences on the strips will help fluency.

- The strips can be photocopied on tag and then cut out.
- The strips are good for buddy reading or partner reading. The children can take turns picking up a strip and reading it to the partner, who checks that the reading is accurate.
- The sheets could be made smaller on the photocopier, and the sentences in one lesson fit on a single sheet of paper to take home to read.
- The students can practice the strips from earlier lessons, too, and as they will be more familiar with this vocabulary this is a good fluency exercise.
  - Use the sentence strips in small groups. Give each child a strip, and they can read the sentences in turn.
  - The strips can be put in a pile and stapled on the left end so they can be 'opened' and read singly.
  - Let the students sort the strips putting all the strips with a special word into a group.
  - Use highlighters to show the most difficult words.
  - Practice printing the sentences in an exercise book.
  - Take a sentence strip and illustrate it.
