

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Lesson 24 Dan's **Imagination** 





"I will try to tell real stories for real things!"




At home Dan talked about the water in the classroom. He talked about the lunch that the teacher got for him.

His mother and father said, "You have a very good imagination. But we said that you should not tell imaginary stories!"


"But this story is real! It is really real!" said Dan. Mother and Father laughed at him.
