Santa Claus, North Pole, Canada HOH OHO


This is Matt's letter.




"Why don't you write to Santa?" Mom suggested. "That's a great idea!" said Matt. He found paper and a pencil and sat down at the kitchen

Dad said, "I know! A shovel to help clean up the snow would be a great present from Santa. New boots to wear when you shovel snow would be helpful, too."


Matt did not think that boots and a shovel were a good idea.












A little train, A candy cane.




On The Christmas Tree








There are silly things We like to make, Some we colour, Some we bake. Some ornaments, Silver and blue, Sparkling lights That twinkle, too.






These candy canes, So sweet and yummy, Are for the tree, Not for your tummy! We hang angels

And other things.







I think and think - what will it be?




