## Ideas for Teaching the September Dolch Words

## 1. My name is

Teach the words my (My), name and is. Print the sentence My name is Ms. Smith (your name) on a chart. Read it aloud, touching under each word as you read. Then print My name is $\qquad$ . and fill in the name of a child. Can that child read it? Have the child come up and touch under each word as he/she reads. Repeat with the names of other children.

Show the word my, and talk about the first sound. Say the word, lengthening the mmmmmm. Put small drawings after $m y$, as in $m y$ book, my pencil, etc.

Mix the three words up and see if the children recognize them.
Talk about where we begin to read and the direction.

## 2. I, a, am, girl, boy.

Review the first three words taught.
Introduce the sentences - I am a girl. I am a boy. You can use stick figure drawings for the girl and boy over the words. Touch under each word.

Talk about the sound $/ a /$, and then add the sound $/ \mathrm{m} /$. Blend the sounds by sliding the hand under the letters. Show the cards for $a$ and $a m$.

For $I$, have the children stand up and draw a line down the body from head to toe as they say $I$.

Look at the words girl and boy. Show the word cards. Put up the cards with the pictures - have a white board or bulletin board for the noun pictures.

Add an /s/ to girl and boy.
Read the sentences: I am a girl. I am a boy. $\qquad$ (child's name) is a girl. $\qquad$ (child's name) is a boy. $\qquad$ is a girl's name. is a boy's name. My name is a girl's name. My name is a boy's name.

## 3. see, cat, dog.

Review the first 8 words taught.
Introduce the word see, and the sentences I see a cat. I see a dog. Could the ee be eyes seeing you? Discuss the /s/sound. Show sees.

Cat and dog are easy words! Show the picture cards and put them up with the girl and boy pictures. Show cats and dogs.

Print sentences from the sentence page on a chart. See the sentence page, and read all the sentences. Touch under each word as you read.

## 4. at, house, school.

Review the first 11 words taught.
Teach the sentences I am at my house. I am at my school.
Introduce the word at. Discuss the sound of $/ \dagger /$, and then show $a$ and am. How are these words the same and how are they different? Blend the sounds.

Teach the words house and school. Show the picture cards and post them.
Print sentences from the sentence page on a chart. See the sentence page, and read all the sentences. Touch under each word as you read.

## 5. the

Review the first 14 words taught.
Show the girl, the boy, the cat, the dog, the house, the school. Have the children take a card with the word the and walk around the classroom. Put the card to the left of an object, and read the desk (for example). Give all the students a chance to do this.

Print sentences from the sentence page on a chart. See the sentence page, and read all the sentences. Touch under each word as you read.

## 6. play, like, to

Review the first 15 words taught.
Show the sentence: I like to play. Talk about things you like and things you like to play. Keep referring to the words.

What sound is at the beginning of to ? Talk about the $/ t /$ sound.
Print sentences from the sentence page on a chart. See the sentence page, and read all the sentences. Touch under each word as you read.

## 7. go, ball, fish

Review the first 18 words taught.
Show go with a capital and read Go to the house.
Show sentences and discuss letter sounds. Read the sentence page as in previous lessons. Show the words beginning with capital letters.
