

Counting to 100

Ideas for use:

- Print the first page and cut out around each set of 10 numbers. They can be glued together to make a number line to 100.
 - Have the child find a specific number.
 - The student can count orally, touching each square.
 - You can use this number line for addition and subtraction - $63 + 4$ or $48 - 6$, for example. Stand on the first number and count on or back by walking the number line.

- Print the second sheet and fill it in with numbers.
 - Stress making small neat numbers!
 - Use the sheet to count by 10's, 5's and 2's. These could be coloured in.
 - It can also be used as a help for beginning multiplication - colour every third square to 30 (0, 3, 6, 9, etc.) or every fourth square to 40. This gives a pattern of multiplication answers.
